2. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

A. FOIA REQUESTS

Since the last Board Meeting, the District has received six FOIA requests and they have all been replied to in a timely manner.

B. WORTH ELEMENTARY CONSTRUCTION PROJECT UPDATE

The Worth Elementary Construction project is progressing well. The underground water storage is closer to completion every day.

C. HEALTH/LIFE SAFETY AMENDMENT #14 - WORTH ELEMENTARY

DLA, the district's architect, made a Health/Life Safety amendment in ISBEs system so the district can use the \$50K construction grant received in the fall for work on the Worth Elementary roof. Because roofing projects are costly right now, this work will most likely be completed in the summer of 2023.

D. SPECIAL BOARD MEETING

A Special Board Meeting is needed to meet a Request for Proposal timeline and to have as much lead time as possible on a School Security Project being paid for through the COPS school violence prevention grant. At the special meeting, the board will approve the purchase of Electronic Card access for all interior doors in all district buildings and interior security cameras for the commons areas within the buildings. After working extensively with Special Education Consultants from LMT Consulting and MTSS Consulting, Dr. Fleming is recommending four new positions: three new Instruction Interventionist positions (two at WE; one at WW) and one Behavioral Interventional position (district: all grades). All four positions will be posted internally first and then post externally.

3. BUSINESS MANAGER

A. WELLNESS COMMITTEE MEETING SCHEDULED FOR 3/14/22

- A. Wellness Committee Meeting scheduled for Monday, March 14, 2022
 - a. Local Wellness Policy is a priority
 - i. A local school wellness policy is a written document that guides a school district's efforts to establish a school environment that promotes students' health, well-being, and ability to learn.
 - b. Other items of concern for the Wellness Committee meeting includes a possible Wellness Initiative for the community, such as a 5k.
 - c. We will also discuss student topics such as food allergies.

B. FOOD TASTING STUDENT COMMITTEE IN APRIL OR MAY

- A. Food Tasting Committee in April or May
 - a. Quest, our Food Service provider, will come to each school building to conduct taste testing for new food items for next school year
 - b. We will select students based on those that frequently order meals
 - c. We will send home a permission slip in advance for parents to sign
 - d. Kids love this! We did it last in Spring 2019

C. KICKED OFF "EMPLOYEE WELLBEING COMPETITION" ON MONDAY, MARCH 7

- A. Employee Wellbeing Competition started 3/7/22
 - a. There are 4 school districts in our health insurance cooperative participating
 - b. Each week, after successfully participating in that week's challenge, fill out a raffle ticket for a monthly drawing of a \$50 Amazon gift card
 - c. Weekly challenges include scheduling a preventative care visit with your doctor or dentist, avoiding fast food for a week, working on personal finances or visiting a financial adviser, eating a piece of fresh fruit with lunch for one week, go on a hike, etc.

D. RESOLUTION FOR PROPERTY TAX RELIEF GRANT

- A. Resolution for Property Tax Relief Grant
 - a. For Property Tax Years 2021 and 2022, the taxes are abated in the amount of \$929,707 each year. These savings are passed on to the community so the average homeowner gets approximately \$225 annual reduction from their tax bill.
 - i. Because spring tax bills already went out, the first year will be reflected in the August bills
 - b. The District is then eligible for a grant in the amount of \$889,869 per year which will be received from Evidence Based Funding through ISBE.

E. RESOLUTION FOR RECAPTURE LEVY

- A. Resolution for Recapture Levy
 - a. As discussed over the past few months, the new Property Tax Code (35 ILCS 200/18-233) states that the taxing district levy shall be increased by a prior year adjustment whenever an assessment decrease is granted due to the issuance of a certificate of error, tax payer refund, or Property Tax Appeal Board results in a refund.
 - b. Cook County Treasurer certified the total refunds paid by the district in the past 12 months was \$244,213, which, without this resolution, would automatically be added to our levy that was filed in December 2021.
 - c. By filing this resolution, the refund total \$244,213 is abated and the Levy originally filed in December is the final levy for 2021.
