Good Shepherd Center

Good Shepherd Center, a community advocate for children and adults, with and without disabilities, provides support, services, and education that empower individuals and families to lead exceptional lives. Their services include in-home respite programs, children and adult waiver programs, and community partner programs, among others.

Illinois Respite Coalition

The Illinois Respite Coalition (IRC) is a not-for-profit organization of caregivers and respite providers dedicated to advocating support for families by ensuring access to quality respite services for the residents of Illinois. The IRC is dedicated to spreading the awareness of lifespan respite for caregivers of individuals with special needs. The IRC is able to assist caregivers by connecting them to resources in their area, provide training on respite topics, and providing funding available through our various programs including: in-home respite, voucher respite, emergency respite, and the lending library program.

Swim Learn Play is an aquatic speech therapy company that takes therapy outside of the clinic. Our children get direct, 1 on 1 speech therapy services and basic water safety skills in an aquatic setting. When children's sensory needs are met, their communication skills tend to thrive; being in the water can help accomplish just that. Along with our background in water activities/sports, our passion for working with the neurodiverse pediatric population on communication skills allowed us to combine our expertise in a way that would provide maximal benefits to our clients by addressing two major areas for growth at once.

<u>SWSRA</u>

South West Special Recreation Association (SWSRA) was formed in 1981 to provide year-round quality therapeutic recreation programs and services for individuals with intellectual and/or physical disabilities. SWSRA programs offer a wide variety of programs for individuals in early childhood through adulthood. These programs are designed to increase independence and enhance the quality of life for each individual. SWSRA works to provide an inclusive environment in which allows the participants to thrive in recreational settings with their peers. This includes but is not limited to individuals who have varying degrees of physical or mental disabilities, learning disabilities, behavior disorders, and hearing or visual impairments.

SWSRA is comprised of member districts that include: Alsip Park District, Blue Island Park District, Hickory Hills Park District, Village of Merrionette Park, Midlothian Park District, Palos Heights Parks & Recreation Department, Posen Park District, and Worth Park District.

Services include Community Mental Health and Counseling, Community Education, and Life Skills Enrichment programs, among others.

- Assistance in enrolling in the Illinois database (PUNS) which is necessary to receive services.
- Action Plan for pursuing services and support in coordination with the family.
- Access to services which include residential and community day services, Home-Based programs, respite services and linkage to a variety of community resources.
- Advocacy to ensure that services provided meet the needs of the individual and standards of Illinois.

<u>CEDA</u>

The Community and Economic Development Association of Cook County, Inc. (CEDA) is one of the largest private, nonprofit Community Action Agencies in the country, serving residents throughout Cook County, Illinois. We serve more than 300,000 people and more than 150,000 households every year. PACE at National Louis

P.A.C.E. at National Louis University (NLU) is a three-year post-secondary program designed for young adults with multiple intellectual, learning and developmental disabilities ready to thrive in the vibrant city of Chicago! We are one of the leading residential-based programs in the country that integrates employment preparation, independent living skills coaching, functional academic courses and social development into a curriculum that prepares students for independent living through experiential learning.

Students have a range of intellectual, learning and developmental disabilities, most often in areas of language, mathematics, reading comprehension, abstract reasoning, as well as organizational and social difficulties. Student diagnoses include learning and intellectual disabilities, high-functioning autism spectrum disorders, executive function disorder, speech and language impairments, and other similar disabilities that interfere with learning and success in a traditional college program.

Illinois ABLE Accounts

IL ABLE "Achieving a Better Life Experience" Accounts give people with disabilities and their families greater financial independence while preserving benefits. A high-quality, low-cost IL ABLE savings and investment Account can be opened by an Eligible Individual, or Authorized Individual, at any time, no matter what state they live in.

Savings in an IL ABLE Account are not counted in determining entitlement to any federal needs-based benefits. This includes such programs as Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI), Medical Assistance (Medicaid), Supplemental

Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), housing assistance programs, and federal financial aid for higher education.

Illinois Service Resource Center

The Illinois Service Resource Center provides behavior support for students who are deaf, hard of hearing, or visually impaired in Illinois.

ISRC team members work with educators and families onsite to develop individualized behavior support plans.

Behavior support can be for individual students with challenges, or at the preventive level with classrooms or school programs. ISRC serves students with hearing loss regardless of communication mode. ISRC provides behavior support for parents who are themselves deaf or hard of hearing, regardless of the hearing status of the child.

Aunt Martha's Health & Wellness
