School Attendance Matters Updates

Thank you families for your partnership in getting your child to school each day! Having their arrival at school when doors open at 8:00 a.m. will set a positive tone for a great start to the school day. Chronic absenteeism is defined as students missing 10% of the school year for **any reason** (excused or unexcused), which is equivalent to 18 days.

Our goal for this school year has been to decrease our chronic absenteeism of 36% during the 2023-2024 school year to 26% for the 2024-2025 school year. It will continue to be our school's goal to improve our attendance rate for the upcoming school year by working with families on the importance of students being here each day they are not ill. We ask over the summer to please consider planning any appointments or travel plans around student holidays. We appreciate your partnership in helping encourage your child to be at school each day.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Students should miss no more than 9 days of school each year to stay engaged, successful and on track to graduation.
- Frequent absences can be a sign that a student is losing interest in school, struggling with school work, dealing with a bully or facing some other difficulty.
- By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.
- By 9th grade, attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.
- Missing 10%, or 2 days a month, over the course of the school year, can affect a student's academic success.

Remaining Early Dismissal

Our last early dismissal days will be on Friday, May 24. Just as a reminder that these days provide our staff the opportunity for Professional Development and School Improvement. Worth Junior High students are dismissed at 1:15 p.m. and will have an earlier lunch each of those days.

Advisory Update

This month our students will continue our reading of our all-school book read *And Then, Boom!* authored by Lisa Fipps. The novel is focused around how the main character manages difficult situations and looks to persevere. We are looking forward to this opportunity for our school community to engage in reading together!.

Our staff continues to educate our students in advisory about Digital Citizenship to grow their mindset as they each become safer and more responsible digital citizens in our world. This includes how students interact with one another online and how those choices can have a serious impact on our whole-school community. We will be continuing to explore the digital platform Xello during both advisory and the STEM class. Just a reminder, Xello is a digital career exploration program in which students learn about

potential careers based on their interests and understand different pathways related to various careers.
