School Attendance Matters Updates

Your partnership in helping us emphasize the importance of your child being here at school continues to be so valuable! Ensuring students arrive when doors open at 8:00 a.m. will set a positive tone for a great start to the school day. Just a reminder that the State Board of Education defines "chronic absenteeism" as students missing ten percent of the school year, which is 18 school days.

WJH Attendance Tiers After 30 Days of School	Percentage of WJH Students
Tier 1a: Satisfactory attendance Miss less than 5% of our school days	53.2 %
Tier 1b: At risk attendance Miss between 5 - 9.9% of our school days	18.7%
Tier 2: Moderate chronic absence Miss between 10 - 19.9% of our school days	21.2%
Tier 3: Severe chronic absence Miss more than 20% of our school days	7.1%

The last two above categories (moderate and severely chronic absences) can have an adverse impact on student growth/achievement in school. We will be in contact in the coming weeks with families if your child falls into the chronically absent category and discuss ways in which we can work together to support their attendance at school.

We know that circumstances arise and illness occurs, so we ask for your assistance in helping your student(s) to be present for school each and every day. If they are fever free for twenty-four hours without medication or have not thrown up in twenty-four hours, please consider sending them to school.
