ADVISORY UPDATES

Students will learn about and reflect on the different types of bullying and harassment and how to effectively address bullying and harassment in order to ensure our school community is a safe and comfortable place for all students to learn and grow successfully.

In addition, Worth Junior High School's students recently engaged in digital citizenship activities during advisory. During these activities, sixth graders learned about all the ways we consume, create, and share digital media in our daily lives while reflecting on its omnipresence. Seventh graders learned to think carefully before posting and sharing information by comparing their digital footprints to things such as a permanent marker, a copy machine, or a jumbotron at a stadium. Eighth graders heard about what other teens have to say about how digital media has them feeling "hooked," then thought critically about their own digital media use..
